Alberta Whitson, age 93 of Albia died Friday September 11, 2009, at the Monroe Care Center in Albia.

Alberta was born December 2, 1915, in Avery, to Angelo and Delitta (Del Vesco) Sebben. She married Cecil Whitson on January 2, 1937 in Albia. They were blessed with 54 years of marriage and six children. Cecil died at the age of 79, on August 3, 1991.

Alberta was a homemaker, raising her family, and worked at Smith Laundry. Alberta was preceded in death by her parents; her husband, Cecil; one son, Steven Whitson; one granddaughter; one great grandson; four brothers; and five sisters.

Alberta is survived by four sons, Larry (Phyllis) Whitson of Albia, Jerry Whitson of Melrose, Philip (Diane) Whitson of Albia, and Wayne Whitson of Louisville, KY; and one daughter, Carolyn (Jim) Plum of Albia. Alberta is also survived by 18 grandchildren; 33 great grandchildren; 10 great great grandchildren; and one sister, Harriet Ethell of Knoxville.
