Arlene F. Bernard, age 87, of Albia, passed away Friday, May 18, 2012, at Ridgewood Care Center in Ottumwa.

Arlene was born June 25, 1924 in Columbus Junction, IA to Earl and Lois (Orr) Bettis. She graduated from Albia High School in 1942. She attended Central College and later Drake University and for many years taught in country schools and in the elementary grades in the Blakesburg and Albia districts. Arlene and John lived in Illinois for several years and upon returning she managed the North Casey's store in Albia.

Arlene married John D. Bernard on December 24, 1945, at the Presbyterian Church in Albia. John died on May 19, 2006. She was a long time member of Trinity United Methodist Church, where she was active in the Women's Circle and Trinity Builders Sunday school class. She enjoyed Witnessing for the Lord by drawing and making bulletin boards for her church.

Arlene is survived by her four daughters, Sheryl Briggs of Rock Island, IL, Shirley Walker of Ottumwa, Sandi (Dave) Johnson of Albia, and Sheila DeBolt of Sandwich, IL; seven grandchildren; 11 great grandchildren; and her sister, Wanda Johnson of Albia.

Arlene was preceded in death by her husband; parents; an infant brother,

Rollin; an infant sister, Marilyn; her brother, Donald; and a son-in-law, Ronald Walker.

Funeral services will be 10:30 a.m., Wednesday, May 23, 2012 at Trinity United Methodist Church in Albia, with Pastor Neil Montz officiating. Burial will be in Service Chapel Cemetery.

Visitation will open to the public at 11 a.m., Tuesday, May 22, 2012 at Tharp Funeral Home in Albia, with Arlene's family present from 6-8 p.m
