Bobbie Dow Seibert Jr. age 74, of Las Vegas, Nevada, formerly of Albia, passed away on July 15, 2016, at his home in Las Vegas.

Bobbie was born June 28, 1942, to Bobbie Sr. and Anna Mae (Gilmore) Seibert in Des Moines. He graduated from Albia High School with the class of 1960, Centerville Community College and Northeast Missouri State Teachers College with a degree in Education.
