Della Ruth Parker, age 83, of rural Albia, went home to be with the Lord on Wednesday, March 24, 2010.

Della Ruth was born November 13, 1926, in Harvey, Iowa to Gerrit John and Blanche Laurel (Larew) Roorda. She grew up, attended and graduated from Harvey High School Class of 1944. After high school Ruth married Harold Paul Parker on January 28, 1945 at the Harvey Methodist Church in Harvey, Iowa. They were blessed with 65 years of marriage and five daughters.

Ruth was a homemaker and after her girls were raised she went back to school and graduated from the nursing program at Indian Hills Community College in Centerville. Ruth worked at the VA Hospital in Knoxville as an LPN, and she farmed with her husband. Ruth attended church at the Albia Baptist Temple, and was a member of the American Legion Auxiliary. She helped start Hospice of Monroe County, and was Volunteer of the Year. She also enjoyed crafts, sewing, and cooking, especially making donuts.

Ruth is survived by her 5 daughters, Patricia (Bob) Carter of Marion, Dorothy (Don) Engelking of Knoxville, Dixie Harnden of Des Moines, Mary Ann (Donald) Schramm of Russell, and Bonnie (Randy) Williams of Eddyville; 16 grandchildren; 2 step grandchildren; 17 great grandchildren; and 10 step great grandchildren. Ruth is also survived by her best friend Marvania Leeper, special niece Betty (Bill) Maxwell and a host of other family and friends.
