Greg Laverne McCoy, 51, passed away Wednesday, November 5, 2014 near his home in Moravia, Iowa

He was born September 14, 1963 in Centerville, Iowa to Max L (Curg) and Joyce Walter McCoy. Greg graduated from Moravia High School with the class of 1981 and Indian Hills Community College in 1983. After college, Greg worked in Lawton, Oklahoma at a rock quarry. After returning home to Iowa, he worked construction until he began working for Bridgeport, then Cargill in Eddyville, Iowa for several years. In recent years, you could find Greg working on the family farms where he loved to be. He was a member of Antiquity Lodge #252

Greg married Kim Vinton in 1988. To this union, a son, Cory Reed, was born on January 10, 1989. On April 28, 1992, Greg and Kelly Cridlebaugh welcomed his second son, Miles Gregory. Greg's greatest pride was his boys and they were the light of his life.

cooking large amounts of meat for family gatherings, going to Hwy 5 Auctions, and teasing his nieces and nephews.

Greg's light shined bright and he loved to have a good time. If you needed something figured out, a favor, or a helping hand he was your guy. He could fix anything and he never met a stranger. This world is a better place because he was here.

He was preceded in death by his grandparents, Max and Mary (Polly) McCoy and Loren and Ardis Walter.
