James "Jim" Schultz, age 41, of Albia, passed away on Thursday, June 10, 2010, at his home in Albia.

Jim was born December 31, 1968, in California to Ken (Elsa) Green and Kaaron (Rick) Schultz. He graduated from high school and served in the United States Army. He was stationed as a combat medic at Walter Reed Hospital in Washington DC. Jim served his country from 1987 to 1990. After his service he graduated from Indian Hills Community College with a paramedic degree.

On September 24, 1993 Jim married Melinda Anne "Molly" Tedore at the Blessed Sacrament Church in Waterloo, Iowa. They shared 16 years of marriage and were blessed with two children.

Jim worked as a paramedic specialist all his life. He began with the Monroe County Hospital and later worked with the V.A. Medical Center in Knoxville and was currently working with the V.A. Medical Center in Des Moines. Jim enjoyed deer hunting and riding motorcycles. He collected motorcycle memorabilia, and for several years helped coach and was the medical assistant for the Albia 5th and 6th grade football program. He was also a member of the Cycle Disciples and active with the Patriot Guard.

He is survived by his wife Molly Schultz; his children, Abbi and Alex Schultz all of Albia; his parents, Kaaron and Rick Schultz and Ken and Elsa Green; and one brother, Ryan "Bubba" Schultz. Jim is also survived by his mother and father-in-law Tom and Jane Tedore.

Jim was preceded in death by his grandparents.

Private services for family and close friends will be held Monday, June 14, at St. Mary's Catholic Church. Burial will follow services at Oak View Cemetery in Albia, with military rites provided by the American Legion, Howard Cessna Post #136 of Albia.

A celebration of Life Service will be held from 2:00 P.M., to 5:00 P.M., Sunday, June 13, 2010, at the Winfield Funeral Home in Albia, with the family present.
