Joseph Charles Mitchell, age 79 of Albia, Iowa and Fountain Hills, Arizona passed away Thursday morning, December 31, 2009, at the Eckstein Hospice Center in Scottsdale, Arizona.

Joseph was born on April 3, 1930, to Worth and Laura (Schreck) Mitchell in Chariton, Iowa. Joe was raised on a farm near Chariton, went to country school and graduated from Chariton High School, class of 1949. After graduation Joe worked and later served in the United States Navy, during the Korean War.

Joseph married Mary Lee Davison on June 3rd 1953 in Long Beach, California. They were blessed with 56 years of marriage and two children, Mark and Lynn.

After his military service Joe began to work for Hy-Vee Grocery, in the meat department. He worked for Hy-Vee for over 35 years, retiring as a meat department manager.

Joseph was very active all his life. He was a member of St. Paul's Lutheran Church, a 50 plus year member of the Masonic Lodge, and a member of the American Legion, all of Albia. He also enjoyed golfing, reading, grilling, and traveling. After his retirement Joe and his wife began to winter in Arizona. They vacationed in Arizona for 18 years.

Joseph was preceded in death by his parents, Worth and Laura Mitchell; and four brothers, Kenneth, Dale, Calvin, and Jerry Mitchell; and three sisters, Dorothy Mitchell, Edna Stansberry, and Margaret Morrison.

Joseph is survived by his wife, Mary Mitchell of Albia; two children, Mark Mitchell and wife Carol of Milan, Ill., and Lynn Popson of West Des Moines; four grandchildren, Joshua Mitchell, Kristopher (Sara) Popson, Cassie (Jason) Butler, and Megan Popson; and two great grandchildren, Sophia Popson, and Blake Butler.
