Miladean June Garrett, age 87 of Albia, passed away peacefully on December 27, 2017, at Monroe Care Center in Albia.

As next door neighbors, Miladean and I shared many joys and tribulations of raising our kids. One story I especially remember was Miladean's rose. After she planted it, someone told her it would not bloom until it had 5 leaves. Every day Miladean counted those leaves. One night I fastened a large plastic rose to her plant.
