Paul Arthur McGrath, age 74, of Albia, died Friday May 15, 2009, at the Monroe County Hospital in Albia, Iowa.

Paul was born on June 24, 1934, in Melrose, Iowa to Edward Martin and Marie Veronica (Scieszinski) McGrath. He attended and graduated from Melrose High School Class of 1951. On November 4, 1961, Paul married Louanne Musick in the Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Chariton, Iowa. They were married for forty-seven years.

After school Paul farmed and drove a stock truck, and worked at Keywash in Melrose, before he began working with Monroe County. From 1962 to 1976 he was a heavy equipment operator for Monroe County. In 1976 he began to work for Star Coal Company. He worked for ten years running a scraper and later a maintainer, before the company closed. After the coal company closed he worked for Monroe County for a few more years until retiring in 2000. He continued to work part time for Monroe County.

Paul enjoyed spending time gardening, and making scroll saw woodworking projects.

Paul is survived by his wife, Louanne of Albia; two sons, Gary McGrath of Albia, and Jim McGrath of Eldon; Paul is also survived by five grandchildren. Paul was preceded in death by his parents; Edward and Marie.
