Pauline Marie O'Connor, age 96 of Chariton, formerly of Melrose, died Saturday, May 25, 2013, at Chariton Nursing and Rehabilitation Center in Chariton.

Pauline was born August 9, 1916 to James "Pop" and Rose (McGinn) Griffin in Georgetown, IA. She married Pat O'Connor on January 1, 1944 in Los Angeles, CA. They were married 40 years before Pat preceded her in death on August 16, 1984.
