Richard Fredrick Haeussler, age 80, of Albia, passed away January 6, 2016 at the Pella Regional Health Center in Pella.

Richard was born June 22, 1935, in Brooklyn, New York to Andrew and Helen (Johnson) Haeussler. He grew up and graduated from Brooklyn Technical High School. He then went on to get his Bachelors Degree in Marine Engineering at Fort Schuyler and following that he got his Masters in Business at Rutgers University. Richard served his country in the United States Navy. Richard married Nell Lamb on March 30, 1963 in Mobile, Alabama. To this union 3 children were born, David, Nancy, and Amy. They shared almost 53 years of marriage before Richards passing.

Richard worked for the Worthington Corporation as a project manager and worked for Combustion Engineering as a business manager. Later he worked for Shell Oil Company as a procurement manager purchasing materials to build refineries until he retired in 2000. Richard was a member of the Pioneer Cemetery Board and the Albia Library Board. He volunteered his time with many different church councils. He enjoyed singing in the church choir, reading, wood working and had a love for animals.

Richard is survived by his wife Nell of Albia; his children, David (Noushi) Haeussler of Raleigh, North Carolina, Nancy (Craig) Hendel of Appleton,
