Sharon Sue Lundstrom, age 81, of Albia, passed away Thursday, July 28, 2011, at the Monroe County Hospital in Albia.

Sharon was born February 6, 1930 in Osawatomie, KS to Andrew Jackson and Bertha Eva (Peterson) Maberry. She lived in Jefferson City, MO until the age of 12, and then moved to Hiteman and graduated from Albia High School. She married Vernon Lundstrom on June 26, 1948 in Albia. They shared 41 years of marriage together before Vernon's passing on January 9, 1990.

Sharon worked for United Mine Workers, Blue Cross & Blue Shield, and for Farm Bureau Insurance Companies. She later worked at Chicago Rivet and was a homemaker all of her life. She was a member of St. Mary's Catholic Church in Albia. She enjoyed swimming and also taught senior citizens water aerobics. She loved to read, travel, and garden, along with being outdoors; taking care of her flowers and sitting on her deck visiting with friends and family.

Sharon is survived by her children, John (Judy) Lundstrom of Albia, Suzanne Lundstrom, Susan Lundstrom, both of Des Moines, Lucinda (Tom) Gillenwater of Indianola, and Rick Lundstrom of Des Moines; five grandchildren; and seven great grandchildren. She is also survived by a sister, Shirley Lundstrom of Ottumwa; two brothers, Jack (Carol) Maberry of Bella Vista, AR and John

(Bernice) Maberry of Silvis, IL; and many nieces and nephews.

Sharon was preceded in death by her husband, Vernon; and her parents.

A memorial service will be held at 11:00 AM, Tuesday, August 2, 2011 at St. Mary's Catholic Church in Albia, with Father Michael E. Volkmer, C.P.P.S. as celebrant . Burial will follow services at Oak View Cemetery in Albia.

Visitation will be held from 1:00 PM until 8:00 PM, Monday, August 1, 2011 at the Tharp-Winfield Funeral Home in Albia. Sharon's family will be present from 4-8 PM. A rosary will be led Monday at 4:00 PM, provided by the St. Mary's Altar and Rosary Society, and a Christian Wake Service will also be held at the funeral home, Monday evening at 6:30 PM.
