Val J. Mannens, age 72 of West Des Moines, formerly of Albia, died Saturday, April 14, 2012 under the care of Mercy Hospice, at his home in West Des Moines.

Val was born July 28, 1939 in Mason City, IA to Henry and Margaret "Peg" (Cookman) Mannens. He married Mary "Margie" Kenworthy on September 2, 1961 at St. Mary's Catholic Church in Albia.

A graduate of Manly High School in Mason City, Val attended Mason City Junior College where he was an All-American quarterback in 1959. He was an outstanding athlete, playing baseball, football, and basketball throughout high school and college. He spent over 40 years selling steel tubing for Vision Metals. During his retirement, he was one of the helpful smiles delivering for the Mills Civic Hy-Vee.
